CALL FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST FOR THE SUPPLY OF A MOTOR VEHICLE

1.0 ABOUT ANTI-CORRUPTION COALITION UGANDA:

Anti-Corruption Coalition Uganda (ACCU) was formed in January 1999 and formally registered as an NGO under the NGO Statute in 2004. ACCU brings together like-minded entities and individual actors whose pre-occupation is publicizing, exposing and advocating for curbing corruption in Uganda. ACCU with support from different Development Partners has been implementing interventions since 1999, with the aim of creating an accountable and corruption free society. At the national level, ACCU works with Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) engaged in the accountability sector. At the local level, ACCU works with and through Regional Anti-Corruption Coalitions (RACCs) that are spread out in the various parts of the country and of recent grass root member organizations. This approach ensures that the citizens' voices are reflected into the national agenda.

2.0 PROJECT BACKGROUND:

Uganda annually loses Ugx 9.14tn to corruption, which is approximately 18% of the national budget.¹ In addition, the annual Corruption Perception Index by Transparency International has consistently ranked Uganda poorly in terms of fighting corruption despite government's effort to establish legal, policy and institutional frameworks to fight corruption.² Uganda has also been in the midst of several corruption scandals involving billions of shillings and spanning over decades.

Corruption in Uganda is mainly caused by; weak citizen capacity to engage government on accountability, limited citizen monitoring of public services, limited access to information, low state responsiveness to citizen accountability demands, poor implementation of anti-corruption laws, limited capacity of anti-corruption agencies, impunity, patronage and mild political will to fight some forms of corruption. The unabated corruption has resulted into; poor public service delivery, high cost of delivering public services, increasing national debt burden, denial of basic human rights, under-development and worsening economic conditions.

In order to address these challenges, ACCU is implementing a 4-year project titled "Civic Engagement for Accountability Project (CEAP)". The project aims to strengthen accountability of state actors in Uganda and; enhance the capacity of non-state actors to demand for accountability. This will ultimately contribute to improved transparency and accountability among state and non-state actors in Uganda. The project is implemented at national level and 8 districts of; Yumbe, Terego, Madi-Okollo and Obongi in West Nile and Moroto, Napak, Nakapiripirit and Nabilatuk in Karamoja targeting 7,200 youth; 1,360 government stakeholders; 50 CSOs; 80 Community Based Monitors and; 9,840,200 citizens directly and indirectly.

3.0 JUSTIFICATION:

Corruption in Uganda is systematic, systemic, syndicated and astronomical in proportion. This has been facilitated by a number of factors including low citizen capacity to engage leaders on accountability and citizen apathy, among other factors. ACCU seeks to equip citizens, with skills and knowledge to engage their leaders on matters of accountability and good governance. This will mainly be through several engagements at the local and national level, which require constant travel for staff and partners involved in project implementation. ACCU therefore seeks a supplier for a motor vehicle, to support project implementation in the aforementioned areas.

4.0 ASSIGNMENT OBJECTIVE:

The general objective of this assignment is to procure a motor vehicle, to support project implementation, as per the specifications listed below.

5.0 SPECIFICATIONS:

Below are the required specifications for the Motor Vehicle;

- 1) **Body Style:** Toyota Hiace, Van / Commuter (RHD).
- 2) Wheel Type: Four Wheel Drive.
- 3) **Doors:** Four to Five.
- 4) **Engine Capacity:** 2000cc and above.
- 5) **Engine type:** Preferably 2KD, or 1KD.
- 6) Fuel Type: Diesel.
- 7) Color: Preferably White, Silver or Gray.
- 8) Transmission: Automatic or Manual.
- 9) **Dimensions:** Ground clearance of 300mm.
- 10) **Safety Features:** Anti-lock Braking System (ABS), Dual Airbags, Alarm System, Engine Immobilizer; (Optional additional features include a bull bar and winch).
- 11) Environmental Standards: Preference for low-emission or hybrid models.
- 12) **Accessories:** Central locking, tow hooks, AM/FM Radio with USB, fire extinguisher, first-aid kit; Heavy-duty metal guards for both front and rear protection (e.g., bull bar, rear bumper guard) to prevent damage during off-road use; Heavy-duty floor mats to protect the interior during off-road use; roof rack and; rear air conditioning vents.
- 13) Mileage: Not more than 120,000kms.
- 14) Year of Manufacture: 2012 to 2016.
- 15) Owner's Manual: English.
